The only debut in our country of young cinema in the Baltics and Northern Europe is the International Film Festival «Baltic Debuts». This festival is for both moviegoers and star guests of the westernmost region of Russia. Annually hundreds of amateur films take part in the film festival, behind which stand both young authors and world cinema figures.

At the beginning of September, the Museum of the World Ocean invites everyone to visit the **Water Assembly**. This event takes place on the embankment of the historical fleet. There guests of the festival can enjoy the parade of historical ships, a sailing regatta and an antique fair.

In February, the citizens of Kaliningrad celebrate the **Long Sausage Holiday**. The history of this event dates back to 1520 when the local butchers made a 20-meter sausage. The popularity of the festival was rapidly growing, as well as the length of the sausage. For example, in 1601 the sausage was more than 400 meters. Nowadays, guests of the festival enjoy singing, dancing and, of course, tasting the Prussian sausage.


